Welcome to the 4th Annual Research Symposium on Social Sciences and Humanities (ARSSSH-2017) conducted by the National Centre for Advanced Studies in Humanities and Social Sciences (NCAS) of Sri Lanka. ARSSSH-2017 mainly aims in bringing a wide audience including academics, professionals and policy makers, and research students representing all the disciplines coming under the domain of Social Sciences and Humanities under a single roof, where they deliberate and discuss the research, achievements and advancements in respective fields.
